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#### 1. Qualitative Information on First Half Results

#### (1) Qualitative information on consolidated business performance

In the first half of the consolidated fiscal year ending June 30, 2013 (from July 1, 2012 to December 31, 2012; hereafter "the first half under review"), the world economy continued to decelerate with slower growth in China and other emerging countries and the European sovereign debt problems. However, favorable signs are beginning to emerge, as can be seen in, among other things, the underlying strength of the U.S. economy and recovery expectations associated with the return to power of the Liberal Democratic Party in Japan.

In this environment, MACROMILL, INC. (the "Company") and its consolidated subsidiaries (together, the "Group") continued to strengthen the domestic online research business, the Group's mainstay business, while expanding its business areas and domains to seek new revenue sources. The Group focuses on collecting and analyzing information for strategic business development overseas and new business creation and strives to seek the early attainment of these goals on a continual basis by deploying combinations of business alliances and M&A.

In the domestic online research business, which accounts for most of the Company's net sales, cooperation across the business areas of marketing research and database was strengthened, and organizational alignment was achieved by designating customers as the starting point, to provide integrated solutions to meet their needs

Overseas, we began to see benefits from the ongoing efforts to develop our sales force and marketing strategies for MACROMILL EMBRAIN CO., LTD. ("EMBRAIN") in South Korea, as well as from cost structure reform.

In new business domains, the Company is aggressively developing and investing in a marketing promotion service, which will offer a choice of price ranges, starting from conventional price ranges in a long tail market, and which will be readily accessible to anybody via smartphones. The service will be launched this spring.

To accelerate business development across diverse areas in the future, the Company has redefined its management philosophy, which is "to become the leading innovation company in our society by providing quality marketing services on the cutting edge."

The Company will continue to bring innovation at a dominant speed to achieve further business development and value creation.

In the first half, the Group recorded net sales of 8,362 million yen (an increase of 22.9% year on year), operating income of 1,849 million yen (an increase of 19.6%), ordinary income of 1,932 million yen (up 22.5%), and net income of 1,262 million yen (up 57.9%).

Following are the net sales by service categories. Because disclosure classifications have been changed since the first quarter of this fiscal year, the year on year changes of each service segment were calculated by adjusting the results for the previous fiscal year based on the revised service segments.

### (i) Automatic Research Service

The Automatic Research Service is the market research service using the Automatic Internet Research system (hereinafter "AIRs") uniquely developed by the Company. This is the core service of the MACROMILL Group. During the first half under review, demand for research from almost all general business companies remained strong. As a result, total net sales in this service segment came to 3,887 million yen (up 6.0% year on year).

## (ii) Tabulation Service

Tabulation Service is a service where, after data collection via AIRs, specialist employees produce specific tables and graphs matching the purpose of the relevant research. With the growing need for an integrated service covering everything from fieldwork to data collection, tabulation and analysis, and given the increase in the number of projects requiring tabulation ancillary to fieldwork as well as greater operational efficiencies attributable to reinforced collaboration resulting from organization alignment, total net sales in this service segment rose 9.1% year on year, to 464 million yen.

#### (iii) Analysis Service

Analysis Service covers designing survey forms and questionnaire as well as producing a range of reports after collecting research data. To respond to the rising need for analysis services associated with increasingly diversified and sophisticated marketing issues that customers confront, the Company has been taking steps to bolster the productivity and skills of specialist employees and maintain flexible resource management. As a result, with robust orders from customers in a wide range of industries, total net sales in this service segment climbed 18.5% year on year, to 751 million yen.

#### (iv) Qualitative Research Service (Group Interview, etc.)

Qualitative Research Service carries out group or one-on-one interviews for in-depth insights into the psychology of respondents. The Company acted to further improve productivity by developing comprehensive management structures, and orders from information and telecommunication companies and food manufacturers remained strong. Reflecting these developments, total net sales in this service segment rose 21.4% year on year, to 695 million yen.

#### (v) Customized Research Service

Customized Research Service prepares tailor-made survey sheets and collects research data for more individualized research projects beyond the scope manageable by AIRs. Although there is demand for research that requires special methods and unique design, the scope of research that can be handled by automatic research services has expanded as a result of enhancements to the functionality of AIRs, and research needs have diversified. As a result, total net sales in this service segment fell 3.7% year on year, to 667 million yen.

#### (vi) Global Research Service

This service includes research into overseas markets for domestic companies as well as marketing research for overseas companies. Orders remained robust, particularly from food manufacturers and other companies, and demand from new customers for overseas research increased. As a result, total net sales in this service segment increased 38.3% year on year, to 315 million yen.

#### (vii) QPR Service

QPR Service carries out research services that offer the data of consumers' daily purchasing trends that are collected through the special portable bar code scanner. This service comprises QPR-TRACE, a system that prepares a report in regular format about purchasing trends based on purchasing data collected on a daily basis, QPRMill, a net research service using QPR monitors, QPR-ANALYZE, a system that offers on-the-spot analysis of purchasing data and is able to respond to even sophisticated tabulation in accordance with individual issues, and QPR-SCAPE, a system that offers a profile of purchasers by lifestyle and values. Value offered through this service increased with the enhancement of data quality and the promotion of systems development. As a result, total net sales in this service segment rose 41.1% year on year, to 495 million yen.

#### (viii) Overseas business domain

Overseas business domain comprises sales of consolidated subsidiaries in China and South Korea. The construction of stable frameworks for this business is proceeding steadily, as is evident in the progress in developing customers and expanding research services in China and in the improvement in the sales force and cost structure of EMBRAIN in South Korea. As a result, total net sales in this service segment surged 5706.1% year on year, to 896 million yen.

#### (ix) Other Services

Other Services chiefly consist of AIRsMEMBERS (SaaS-type CRM businesses), a service that combines the functionality of AIRs with customer management (CRM) systems, Brand Data Bank (bdb), a database subscription service that provides consumer profiles based on surveys of 30,000 panel members into possessions, interests, and brand preferences, Mobile Research Service, a service that collects data by using mobile phones, and sales of domestic consolidated subsidiaries. Partly because the Company allocated sales resources to Automatic Research Service, Qualitative Research Service and other services on a priority basis, sales of Other Services fell 12.3% year on year, to 190 million yen.

#### (2) Qualitative information on consolidated financial status

At the end of the first half under review, total assets were valued at 19,452 million yen, a rise of 681 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to an increase in notes and accounts receivable—trade of 679 million yen.

Liabilities stood at 8,587 million yen, decreasing 283 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. This principally reflects increases in accounts payable—other of 200 million yen and in allowance for panelists – points of 130 million yen, which was offset mainly by a decrease in income taxes payable of 557 million yen, as a result of payments of income taxes.

Net assets were 10,865 million yen, an increase of 965 million yen. This is mainly due to a rise in retained earnings of 897 million yen, offsetting a decrease of 158 million yen from the purchase of treasury stock.

#### Cash flows

Cash and cash equivalents (hereinafter "cash") at the end of the first half under review totaled 6,956 million yen.

Cash flows for the first half under review and primary factors behind the reported results are as follows:

#### (Cash flows from operating activities)

Cash provided by operating activities during the first half under review was 604 million yen (up 58.3% year on year).

Major uses of cash included 1,016 million in income taxes paid and an increase of 613 million yen in notes and accounts receivable—trade, which were offset by major sources of cash including income before income taxes and minority interests of 1,849 million yen and depreciation and amortization of 184 million yen.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Cash used in investing activities during the first half under review was 762 million yen (up 87.1% year on year).

The major uses of cash were 494 million yen for payments for sales of investments in subsidiaries resulting in a change in the scope of consolidation and payments for purchase of software of 226 million yen.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Cash used in financing activities during the first half under review was 525 million yen (compared to cash provided by financing activities of 3,286 million yen during the same period last year).

The major uses of cash were 363 million yen in cash dividends paid and payment for the purchase of treasury stock of 161 million yen.
